Dear Families,

Happy New Year!

During the next couple of weeks, we will be administering our computer adaptive achievement test in Math (Edmentum) and Dibels for Reading. For the Math assessment the computer adjusts the difficulty of the questions so that each student takes a unique test. The difficulty of each question is based on how well the student has answered the previous questions. These assessments help teachers identify the instructional level of each student and enables them to better target instruction based on students' needs and strengths. For our beginning readers, the computer automatically plays audio instructions for the student, eliminating the challenges of early learners in the process of beginning to read.

In order to help our children to be successful, the following are ways parents and WECEC staff can work together every day:

- Send your child to school every day on time.
- Make sure your child gets eight hours sleep each night.
- Establish a routine for studying. Give your child a quiet corner to read and regular time to do homework.
- Keep in touch with your child's teacher via e-mail, telephone, agenda, or Class Dojo
- Attend school-wide events, classroom events, and conferences
- Celebrate your child's success (giving verbal praise), no matter how small it may seem. This will keep your child enthusiastic about learning and proud of their work.
- Students should be reading at home every night. This is the single best way to support your child in growing as a reader, and developing a love of reading. If your child is resistant to reading, reading together can be a great motivator.

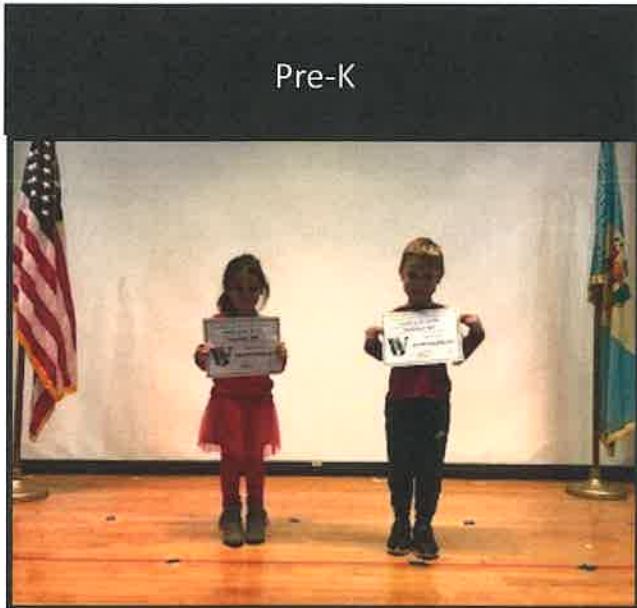
Please know that we welcome your participation, support, and efforts, as they are greatly valued and appreciated. Wishing you a wonderful upcoming year of success in 2020!
